Cédric Anchisi (52 years old) has been a pilot with Air France for 28 years, following his service in the French Navy. A father to Ambre and Éloïse, he tragically lost his younger daughter in 2012 at the age of 10 due to a lung infection. This occurred just months after she had gone into remission from a lymphoma linked to Ataxia Telangiectasia (AT).

Two years earlier, Cédric co-founded ATEurope, an endowment fund with two key aims: supporting families affected by AT and providing financial aid for innovative research focused on this condition, which involves both neurodegeneration and immune deficiency. Collaborations with esteemed institutions like the Imagine Institute and Curie Institute highlight ATEurope's dedication and the scientific interest in AT research. ATEurope also closely partners with CEREDIH, led by Nizar Mahlaoui in Paris. They notably contribute to the French registry for Ataxia Telangiectasia (a part of the ESID registry). Being part of a global association network, ATEurope actively promotes AT research among the worldwide scientific community, engaging in discussions on broader scientific inquiries.
